Empowering Problem Solvers

Now more than ever, children need our help to support their social and emotional development. In her presentation, *Empowering Problem Solvers*, Lindsey Kealey discusses practical ways to apply a trauma-responsive approach to helping children and adults solve problems. Lindsey shares heartwarming and relatable stories of her experience as a preschool and kindergarten teacher and teaches brain-based techniques for supporting children's mental and emotional health from her university research and coaching practice. Educators will leave the session with effective strategies to empower children to learn from mistakes, build empathy, and solve problems.

Lindsey Kealey is an elementary educator, presenter, trainer, classroom coach, and the author of *PAWssitive Choices Social and Emotional Learning Curriculum*. She earned a Bachelor's of Science in Human Development and Family Sciences with an emphasis in child development and has a Masters of Arts in Teaching. Her university work, as well as her experience teaching in public schools, helped her craft a curriculum that integrates neuroscience, social and emotional learning, and problem solving into a program that helps children thrive. Lindsey provides social and emotional learning training for families, classroom coaching and professional development for educators, and university presentations for graduate students.

From the NORTH: Travel South on Hwy 97 to Klamath Falls. Stay on Hwy 97 (Crater Lake Parkway) Klamath Falls/Reno. At end of Crater Lake Parkway turn left onto S. 6th Street. Klamath Community College entrance is 2.2 miles on the right.

From the WEST: Travel East on OR 140 to Klamath Falls. At end of OR 140 turn left onto OR 140E (Southside Bypass). At end of Southside Bypass turn left onto OR 39N. Klamath Community College entrance is 2 miles on the left.

Morning Workshop Sessions

Bldg #4 Building Calming Skills & Brain Break Tool Kits UGB

All ages Fun and practical ways to help children develop healthy ways to cope with stress and regulate feelings to make positive choices will be discussed. Participants will build their own "Brain Break Tool Kit" to foster a calming routine that all children can utilize and love.

#6109 Sound, Sensitive, Authentic Assessment OA

All ages Assessment is an important part of any early childhood program. This training will examine developmentally appropriate assessment and observation strategies in support of the monitoring of each child's development/learning to assist in curriculum development.

#6208 Applying Strategy to the Read Aloud LEC

All ages This workshop will examine and apply strategies and techniques with the "read aloud" that allow the child to demonstrate developmental progression toward understanding communication and language using culturally relevant activities and adult child interactions.

Afternoon Workshop Sessions

#6109 Praise or Encouragement UGB

All ages Actively learn the difference between praise and encouragement and the importance of encouraging children utilizing reflective listening. Develop techniques for improving children's self-concept and self-management behaviors.
